TONIGHT'S PREACHER The Revd Richard Stanton first came to Cambridge as an undergraduate at Pembroke College, where he read Theology. After a year's graduate study in the Faculty of Divinity, he trained for the Priesthood at Westcott House, and following Ordination served a curacy in the Norfolk market town

of Attleborough. Since 2019 he has been Parish Priest of the lively Anglo-Catholic parish of St John the Baptist, Timberhill, in the heart of the medieval city of Norwich, and Priest Director of the Julian Shrine, to which pilgrims from all over the world come in the footsteps of the great English mystic and writer Julian of Norwich, who lived and prayed in a cell attached to the church six centuries ago and whose profound spiritual writings inspire countless people today.
