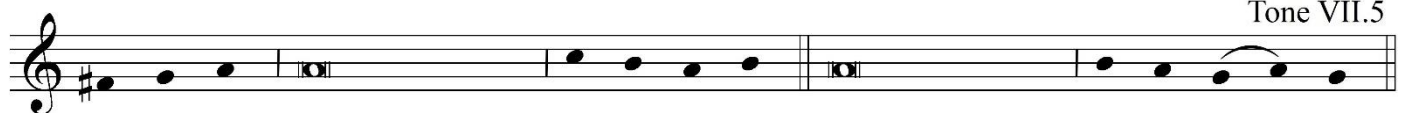

- 1 O PRAISE the Lord, \* laud ye the Name of the Lord :  
praise it O ye ser-vants öf the Lord;
- 2 Ye that stand in the house of the Lord :  
in the courts of the house of öur God.
- 3 O praise the Lord for the Lord is gra-cious :  
O sing praises unto his Name for it is löve-ly.
- 4 For why? \* the Lord hath chosen Jacob un-to him-self :  
and Israel for his own pos-sës-sion.
- 5 For I know that the Lord (-) is great :  
and that our Lord is a-böve all^gods.
- 6 Whatsoever the Lord pleased that did he in heav'n and in earth :  
and in the sea and in all deep plä-ces.
