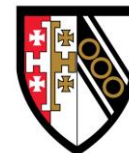


Summer Events Code of Conduct



Selwyn College Cambridge

This code of conduct applies to all participants attending one of Selwyn College's Summer Events. This must be read and agreed by both the participant and their parent/guardian.

Expected Behaviour

Participating in this residential event will be very different from your experience at school/college. We want to ensure that all students benefit from the event and enjoy this new experience. In order to do this, you will be expected to show responsible behaviour throughout the event and respect the rights of other students and staff.

Rules and regulations

For health and safety reasons, and in order for all students to have the opportunity to benefit and enjoy this residential event, the following rules and regulations will be in operation:

- Alcohol must not be brought onto college (and university) grounds or consumed during the event.
- The purchase or use of any illegal substances is strictly forbidden.
- Smoking is not allowed while on the residential.
- Participants are expected to attend and be on-time for all timetabled activities unless otherwise stated (exceptions will only be made where there is a valid reason for absence, such as illness or for religious reasons).
- Students are not allowed to leave college (or university) grounds without permission from appropriate event staff.
- Students are expected to follow any emergency procedure (such as a fire drill), as directed by event staff.
- Males and females are expected to keep to their own accommodation areas.
- Students are expected to be in their rooms after the evening curfew at 22:30.
- Students are not permitted to bring any medication (unless previously declared in the medical permissions form). Any medication brought **MUST NOT** be given to any other student under any circumstances.
- Instructions from staff members (including Student Ambassadors) must be followed at all times.
- The Schools Liaison Officer (or other appropriate member of event staff) must be informed of any problems or concerns during the event.

Serious incidents of misbehaviour

In the event of serious incidents of misbehaviour, such as fighting, racial abuse or the use of illegal substances, the student(s) concerned will not be allowed to continue on the event and arrangements will be made for the student(s) to be taken home.

During the residential event

Throughout the event, staff may explain additional rules and regulations that apply to specific activities. These will be explained at the beginning of sessions and you will be expected to adhere them throughout. Event staff (including Student Ambassadors) will issue first reminders for good behaviour if our expectations are not met, and will report back to the Schools Liaison Officer in case of serious incidents.
