

## Library

The library team have put together a [guide to introduce you to Selwyn Library](#) and to libraries in Cambridge. This will give you a brief introduction to finding the resources you need for your studies, with links to finding out more. It also contains information about the facilities available in the library and how you access them.

You have a brief library tour with your subject group included in your schedule. This will show you where to find books for your subject and what types of study space are available, and will give you the chance to find out more about the college library and libraries in Cambridge and to ask any initial questions you may have. It is a requirement that you attend for fire safety reasons, so we will run extra sessions for those of you who are unable to attend at the scheduled time. If you would like an idea of what to expect from libraries in Cambridge, there are some University guides that may help.
