Further academic support

The many smaller legacies that the college receives every year from alumni and friends make a disproportionate difference to our students' lives. These can be directed towards a wide variety of purposes.

James Thompson (SE 1955) left £10,000 for the study of Law. This will enable Law students to visit The Supreme Court of the UK and to meet a Supreme Court Justice.

In 2024, the college received one of the most generous benefactions it has ever seen, a legacy worth £1.5million from Richard Harvey (SE 1962). Richard had kindly supported the college during his life, typically with a modest annual gift, but chose to make Selwyn College the residuary beneficiary of his estate.

Helpfully, Richard's legacy was unrestricted, which means the college can use it to meet urgent priorities and build the endowment which represents generations of generosity and underpins everything we do.

Richard spent most of his career as librarian at the Guildhall in London, so to commemorate his contribution to Selwyn, our College Librarian's post will now be known as The Richard Harvey Librarian.





Establishing the Harrison Fund

During the last year the Harrison Fund has been generously supported by the whole Selwyn community, raising nearly £1 million to support the teaching of science, engineering and maths.

Fifteen legacies received by the college this year have contributed to this important provision.

The Harrison Fund has been created as a permanent fund at the college, open to receiving legacies and gifts for many years to come. If you would welcome wording on how to include the Harrison Fund in your Will, please do let me know.
