SELWYN CHAPEL

The Chapel exists to serve the colleges of Selwyn and Newnham as a place of beauty, prayer, worship, peace, and challenge. It is open daily from 7am until midnight, and all are welcome to visit it whatever their religious background.

During the course of the week the pattern of services provides a spiritual heartbeat for the community, and the Chapel Choir – one of the best choirs in Cambridge – enriches worship at least three times each week in term.
