- 1 LORD THOU hast *been* our re-fuge : from one generation to ano-*ther*.
- Before the mountains were brought forth or ever the earth and the <u>world</u> were made (---):
 thou art God from everlasting and world without *end*.
- 3 Thou turnest man <u>to</u> de-struc-tion : again thou sayest Come again ye children of <u>men</u>.
- 4 For a thousand years in thy sight are <u>but</u> as yes-ter[^]day : seeing that is past as a watch in the <u>night</u>.
- 5 As soon as thou scatterest them they are even <u>as</u> a sleep (---): and fade away suddenly like the <u>grass</u>.
- 6 In the morning it is green and <u>grow</u>-eth up (---): but in the evening it is cut down dried up and wi-<u>thered</u>.
- 7 For we consume away in <u>*thy*</u> dis-plea-sure : and are afraid at thy wrathful indigna-<u>*tion*</u>.
- 8 Thou hast set our mis-<u>deeds</u> be-fore thee : and our secret sins in the light of thy counte-<u>mance</u>.
- 9 For when thou art angry all our <u>*days*</u> are gone (---): we bring our years to an end as it were a tale that is <u>*told*</u>.
- 10 The days of our age are threescore years and <u>ten</u>; * and though men be so strong that they come to <u>four</u>-score years (---): yet is their strength then but labour and sorrow; * so soon passeth it away and we are <u>gone</u>.

- 11 But who regardeth the power <u>of</u> thy wrath (---): for even thereafter as a man feareth so is thy displea-<u>sure</u>.
- 12 So teach us to num-*ber* our days (---): that we may apply our hearts unto wis-*dom*.
- 13 Turn thee again O Lord <u>at</u> the last (---): and be gracious unto thy ser-<u>vants</u>.
- 14 O satisfy us with thy mercy <u>and</u> that soon (---):so shall we rejoice and be glad all the days of our <u>life</u>.
- 15 Comfort us again now after the time that <u>thou</u> hast plagued us : and for the years wherein we have suffered adversi-<u>ty</u>.
- 16 Shew thy ser-*vants* thy work (---): and their children thy glo-*ry*.
- 17 And the glorious majesty of the Lord our God <u>be</u> up-on us : prosper thou the work of our hands upon us, * O prosper thou our handy-<u>work</u>.

Glory be to the Father and <u>to</u> the Son (---): and to the Holy <u>*Ghost*</u>;

As it was in the beginning is now and \underline{e} -ver shall be : world without end A-<u>men</u>.
