- 1 LORD THOU hast **been** our re-fuge :
from one generation to ano-**ther**.
- 2 Before the mountains were brought forth or ever the earth and the **world** were
made (---):
thou art God from everlasting and world without **end**.
- 3 Thou turnest man **to** de-struc-tion :
again thou sayest Come again ye children of **men**.
- 4 For a thousand years in thy sight are **but** as yes-ter^day :
seeing that is past as a watch in the **night**.
- 5 As soon as thou scatterest them they are even **as** a sleep (---):
and fade away suddenly like the **grass**.
- 6 In the morning it is green and **grow**-eth up (---):
but in the evening it is cut down dried up and wi-**thered**.
- 7 For we consume away in **thy** dis-plea-sure :
and are afraid at thy wrathful indigna-**tion**.
- 8 Thou hast set our mis-**deeds** be-fore thee :
and our secret sins in the light of thy counte-**nance**.
- 9 For when thou art angry all our **days** are gone (---):
we bring our years to an end as it were a tale that is **told**.
- 10 The days of our age are threescore years and **ten**; *
and though men be so strong that they come to **four**-score years (---):
yet is their strength then but labour and sorrow; * so soon passeth it away and
we are **gone**.

- 11 But who regardeth the power of thy wrath (---):
for even thereafter as a man feareth so is thy displea-sure.
- 12 So teach us to num-ber our days (---):
that we may apply our hearts unto wis-dom.
- 13 Turn thee again O Lord at the last (---):
and be gracious unto thy ser-vants.
- 14 O satisfy us with thy mercy and that soon (---):
so shall we rejoice and be glad all the days of our life.
- 15 Comfort us again now after the time that thou hast plagued us :
and for the years wherein we have suffered adversi-ty.
- 16 Shew thy ser-vants thy work (---):
and their children thy glo-ry.
- 17 And the glorious majesty of the Lord our God be up-on us :
prosper thou the work of our hands upon us, * O prosper thou our handy-work.

Glory be to the Father and to the Son (---):
and to the Holy Ghost;

As it was in the beginning is now and e-ver shall be :
world without end A-men.
