- 1 MY HEART sheweth me the wickedness of the un-*god*-ly: that there is no fear of *God* be-fore his eyes.
- 2 For he flattereth himself in his own <u>sight</u> (---): until his abominable <u>sin</u> be found out.
- 3 The words of his mouth are unrighteous and full of de-*ceit* (---): he hath left off to behave himself wisely *and* to do good.
- 4 He imagineth mischief upon his <u>bed</u>, * and hath set himself in no good <u>way</u> (---): neither doth he abhor any thing <u>that</u> is e-vil.
- 5 Thy mercy O Lord reacheth unto the <u>hea</u>-vens: and thy faithfulness <u>un</u>-to the clouds.
- Thy righteousness standeth like the strong *moun*-tains : thy judgements are *like* the great deep.
- 7 Thou Lord shalt save both man and <u>beast</u>; *
 How excellent is thy mercy O <u>God</u> (---):
 and the children of men shall put their trust under the <u>sha</u>-dow of thy^wings.
- 8 They shall be satisfied with the plenteousness of thy *house* (---): and thou shalt give them drink of thy pleasures as out *of* the ri-ver.
- 9 For with thee is the well of <u>life</u> (---): and in thy light <u>shall</u> we see light.
- O continue forth thy loving-kindness unto them that <u>know</u> thee : and thy righteousness unto them <u>that</u> are true of heart.
- O let not the foot of pride come a-*gainst* me : and let not the hand of the un-*god*-ly cast me^down.
- There are they fallen all that work <u>wick</u>-ed^ness: they are cast down and shall not be <u>a</u>-ble to stand.
