- 1 **I WILL** alway give thanks <u>*un*</u>-to the Lord : his praise shall ever <u>*be*</u> in my mouth.
- 2 My soul shall make her <u>boast</u> in the Lord : the humble shall hear there-<u>of</u> and be gläd.
- 3 O *praise* the Lord[^]with me : and let us magnify his <u>Name</u> to-geth-ër.
- 4 I sought the Lord <u>and</u> he heard me : yea he delivered me <u>out</u> of all[^]my fëar.
- 5 They had an eye unto him <u>and</u> were light-ened : and their <u>fa</u>-ces[^]were not[^]a-shämed.
- 6 Lo the poor crieth and the <u>*Lord*</u> hear-eth him : yea and saveth him out of <u>*all*</u> his trou-blës.
- 7 The angel of the Lord tarrieth round about <u>them</u> that fear him : and de-<u>*liv*</u>-er-eth thëm.
- 8 O taste and see how *gra*-cious the Lord^{*}is : blessèd is the man that *trust*-eth in hïm.

- 19 Great are the troubles <u>of</u> the right-eous : but the Lord delivereth <u>him</u> out of äll.
- 20 He <u>*keep*</u>-eth all^{his} bones : so that not one of <u>*them*</u> is brok-ën.
- 21 But misfortune shall <u>*slay*</u> the `un-god-ly : and they that hate the righteous <u>*shall*</u> be des `o-läte.
- 22 The Lord delivereth the <u>souls</u> of his ser-vants : and all they that put their trust in him shall <u>not</u> be des^ti-tüte.
