Cantor 1 I WILL lift up mine eyes unto the <u>hills</u> (---): from whence <u>com</u>-eth my help.

Full 2 My help cometh even from the <u>Lord</u> (---): who hath made *hea*-ven and earth.

Cantor 3 He will not suffer thy foot to be <u>moved</u> (---): and he that keepeth <u>thee</u> will not sleep.

Full 4 Behold he that keepeth <u>Is</u>-ra^el: shall neither <u>slum</u>-ber nor sleep.

Cantor 5 The Lord himself is thy <u>keep</u>-er: the Lord is thy defence up-<u>on</u> thy right hand;

Full 6 So that the sun shall not burn thee by <u>day</u> (---): nei-<u>ther</u> the moon by night.

Cantor 7 The Lord shall preserve thee from all <u>e</u>-vil: yea it is even he <u>that</u> shall keep thy soul.

Full 8 The Lord shall preserve thy going out and thy coming <u>in</u> (---): from this time <u>forth</u> for e-ver more.

- *Cantor* 1 O PRAISE the <u>Lord</u>, * laud ye the Name <u>of</u> the Lord (---): praise it O ye <u>ser</u>-vants of the Lord;
- Full 2 Ye that stand in the house <u>of</u> the Lord (---): in the courts of <u>the</u> house of our God.
- Cantor 3 O praise the Lord for the <u>Lord</u> is gra-cious :O sing praises unto his Name <u>for</u> it is love-ly.
- Full 4 For <u>why</u>? * the Lord hath chosen Jacob un-<u>to</u> him-self (---): and Israel for <u>his</u> own pos-ses-sion.
- Cantor 5 For I know that the <u>Lord</u> is great (---): and that our <u>Lord</u> is a-bove all gods.
- Full 6 Whatsoever the Lord pleased that did he in heaven <u>and</u> in earth (---): and in the sea and <u>in</u> all deep pla-ces.
- Cantor 7 He bringeth forth the clouds from the ends <u>of</u> the world (---): and sendeth forth lightnings with the rain, *bringing the winds <u>out</u> of his trea-sures.
- Full 8 He smote the first-<u>born</u> of E-gypt : (---) <u>both</u> of man and beast.
- Cantor 9 He hath sent tokens and wonders into the midst of thee O thou <u>land</u> of E-gypt (---):
 upon Pharaoh <u>and</u> all his ser-vants.
