- 26 There go the ships and there is *that* Le^{vi-a-than}: whom thou hast made to take his *päs*-time there-in.
- 27 These wait <u>all</u> up-on thee : that thou mayest give them meat <u>in</u> düe sea-son.
- 28 When thou givest it <u>them</u> they^ga-ther it : and when thou openest thy hand <u>they</u> are filled with^good.
- When thou hidest thy face <u>they</u> are trou-bl'd : when thou takest away their breath they die, * and are turned a-<u>gäin</u> tö their dust.
