- 1 THE LORD is my light and my salva-tion, \* whom then shall I fear (---) :  
 the Lord is the strength of my life, \* of whom then shall I be a<sup>^</sup>fraid?
- 2 When the wicked even mine enemies and my foes came upon me to eat up my flesh (---) :  
 they stum-bl'd and fell.
- 3 Though an host of men were laid against me yet shall not my heart be a-fraid (---) :  
 and though there rose up war against me yet will I put my trust in<sup>^</sup>him.
- 4 One thing have I desired of the Lord which I will re-quire (---) :  
 even that I may dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life,  
 \* to behold the fair beauty of the Lord and to vi-sit his tem-ple.
- 5 For in the time of trouble he shall hide me in his ta-ber<sup>^</sup>na<sup>^</sup>cle :  
 yea in the secret place of his dwelling shall he hide me, \* and set me up on a rock of<sup>^</sup>stone.
- 6 And now shall he lift up mine head (---) :  
 above mine enemies round a-bout me.
- 7 Therefore will I offer in his dwelling an oblation with great glad-ness :  
 I will sing and speak praises un-to the Lord.
- 8 Harken unto my voice O Lord when I cry unto thee (---) :  
 have mercy upon me and hear me.
- 9 My heart hath talked of thee, \* Seek ye my face (---) :  
 Thy face Lord will I<sup>^</sup>seek.
- 10 O hide not thou thy face from me (---) :  
 nor cast thy servant away in dis-pleas-ure.
- 11 Thou hast been my suc-cour :  
 leave me not neither forsake me O God of my sal-va-tion.
- 12 When my father and my mother for-sake me :  
 the Lord tak-eth me up.
- 13 Teach me thy way O Lord (---) :  
 and lead me in the right way because of mine e-ne<sup>^</sup>mies.
- 14 Deliver me not over into the will of mine ad-ver<sup>^</sup>sa<sup>^</sup>ries :  
 for there are false witnesses risen up against me, \* and such as speak wrong.

15 I should utterly have faint-ed :

but that I believe verily to see the goodness of the Lord in the land of  
the liv-ing.

16 O tarry thou the Lord's lei-sure :

be strong and he shall comfort thine heart, \* and put thou thy trust in  
the Lord.

and to the Ho-ly^Ghost;

As it was in the beginning is now and ever shall be :  
world with-out end A-men.
