The Lord my pasture shall prepare, and feed me with a shepherd's care; his presence shall my wants supply, and guard me with a watchful eye; my noonday walks he shall attend, and all my midnight hours defend.

When in the sultry glebe I faint, or on the thirsty mountain pant, to fertile vales and dewy meads my weary wandering steps he leads, where peaceful rivers, soft and slow, amid the verdant landscape flow.

Though in a bare and rugged way through devious lonely wilds I stray, thy bounty shall my pains beguile; the barren wilderness shall smile with sudden greens and herbage crowned, and streams shall murmur all around.

Though in the paths of death I tread, with gloomy horrors overspread, my steadfast heart shall fear no ill, for thou, O Lord, art with me still: thy friendly crook shall give me aid, and guide me through the dreadful shade.

EVENING PSALM 23



- 1 The LORD is my *shep*-herd: therefore can *I* lack no-thing.
- 2 He shall feed me in a green <u>pas</u>-ture : and lead me forth beside the wat-<u>ers</u> of com-fort.
- 3 He shall convert my \underline{soul} (---):

and bring me forth in the paths of righteousness for his Name's sake.

- Yea though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death I will fear no <u>e</u>-vil: for thou art with me, * thy rod and thy <u>stäff</u> com-fort me.
- 5 Thou shalt prepare a table before me against them that <u>trou</u>ble^me: thou hast anointed my head with oil and my <u>cup</u> shall be full.
- 6 But thy loving-kindness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my <u>life</u> (---): and I will dwell in the house of the *Lord* for ev-er.

Glory be to the Father and to the \underline{Son} (---): and \underline{to} the Ho-ly Ghost;

As it was in the beginning is now and ever *shall* be: world with-*out* end A-men.

- [Christ has risen from the grave.]
- 2. Dungin is the deidly dragon Lucifer, The crewall serpent with the mortall stang, The auld keen tegir with his teith on char Quhilk in a wait hes lyne for us so lang Thinking to grip us in his clowis strang: he merciful lord wald nocht that it wer so; He maid him for to felye of that fang: Surrexit Dominus de sepulchro.
- 3. He for our saik that sufferit to be slane
 And lyk a lamb in sacrifice wes dicht
 Is like a lyone rissin up agane
 And as a gyane raxit him on hicht;
 Sprungin is Aurora radius and bricht,
 On loft is gone the glorious Appollo,
 The blissful day depairtit fro the nycht:
 Surrexit Dominus de sepulchro.
