- THE HEAV'NS declare the glo-<u>ry</u> of God (---): and the firmament sheweth his handy-<u>work</u>.
- 2 One day tell-*eth* a-no-ther : and one night certifieth ano-*ther*.
- 3 There is neither <u>speech</u> nor lan-guage : but their voices are heard among <u>them</u>.
- 4 Their sound is gone out in-<u>to</u> all lands (---): and their words into the ends of the <u>world</u>.
- 5 In them hath he set a tabernacle <u>for</u> the sun (---): which cometh forth as a bridegroom out of his chamber, * and rejoiceth as a giant to run his <u>course</u>.
- It goeth forth from the uttermost part of the heaven, *
 and runneth about unto the end of <u>it</u> a-gain (---):
 and there is nothing hid from the heat there-<u>of</u>.
- 7 The law of the Lord is an undefiled law convert-*ing* the soul (---): the testimony of the Lord is sure and giveth wisdom unto the sim-*ple*.
- 8 The statutes of the Lord are right and re-*joice* the heart (---): the commandment of the Lord is pure and giveth light unto the *eyes*.
- 9 The fear of the Lord is clean and endur-<u>eth</u> for e-ver : the judgements of the Lord are true and righteous altoge-<u>ther</u>.
- 10 More to be desired are they than gold, * yea than <u>much</u> fine gold (---): sweeter also than honey and the honey-<u>comb</u>.
- 11 Moreover by them is thy <u>ser</u>-vant taught (---): and in keeping of them there is great re-<u>ward</u>.
- 12 Who can tell how oft <u>he</u> of-fend-eth :O cleanse thou me from my secret <u>faults</u>.
- 13 Keep thy servant also from presumptuous sins, * lest they get the do-<u>mi</u>-nion over^{me} : so shall I be undefiled and innocent from the great of-<u>fence</u>.
- 14-15 Let the words of my mouth and the meditation <u>of</u> my heart (---): be alway acceptable in thy sight O Lord my strength and my redeem-<u>er</u>.
