- Blessèd is the man that feareth the <u>Lord</u> (---): he hath great delight in <u>his</u> com-mand-ments.
- 2 His seed shall be mighty upon <u>earth</u> (---): the generation of the faithful <u>shall</u> be bless-èd.
- Riches and plenteousness shall be in his *house* (---): and his righteousness endur-*eth* for e-ver.
- 4 Unto the godly there ariseth up light in the <u>dark</u>-ness: he is merciful lov-<u>ing</u> and right-eous.
- 5 A good man is merciful and *lend*-eth: and will guide his words *with* dis-cre-tion.
- 6 For he shall never be <u>moved</u> (---): and the righteous shall be had in everlast-<u>ing</u> re-mem-brance.
- 7 He will not be afraid of any evil <u>ti</u>-dings: for his heart standeth fast and be-*lie*-veth in the Lord.
- 8 His heart is established and will not <u>shrink</u> (---): until he see his desire up-<u>on</u> his e-ne[^]mies.
- 9 He hath dispersed abroad and given to the <u>poor</u> (---): and his righteousness remaineth for ever; * his horn shall be exal-<u>ted</u> with ho-nour.
- The ungodly shall see it and it shall *grieve* him: he shall gnash with his teeth and consume away; * the desire of the ungod-*ly* shall perish.

- 5 A froward heart shall depart from <u>me</u> (---): I will not know a wick-<u>ed</u> per-son.

- Whoso hath also a proud look and high <u>sto</u>-mach: I will not <u>suf</u>-fer him.
