- O PRAISE the Lord, * laud ye the <u>Name</u> of the Lord : praise it O ye <u>ser</u>-vants öf the Lord;
- 2 Ye that stand in the *house* of the Lord : in the courts of the *house* of our God.
- O praise the Lord for the <u>Lord</u> is gra-cious : O sing praises unto his Name for <u>it</u> is löve-ly.
- 4 For <u>why</u>? * the Lord hath chosen Jacob <u>un</u>-to him-self : and Israel for his <u>own</u> pos-sës-sion.
- 5 For I know that the <u>Lord</u> (-) is great : and that our Lord <u>is</u> a-böve all gods.
- Whatsoever the Lord pleased that did he in <u>heav'n</u> and in earth: and in the sea and in <u>all</u> deep plä-ces.



- He bringeth forth the clouds from the *ends* of the world : and sendeth forth lightnings with the rain, * bringing the winds out <u>of</u> his trëa-sures.
- He smote the *first*-born of E-gypt : 8 (---) **both** of män and beast.

- 12 And gave their land to <u>be</u> an he^ri-tage : even an heritage unto Isra-*el* his pëo-ple.
- Thy Name O Lord en-<u>dur</u>-eth^{*} for e-ver: 13 so doth thy memorial O Lord, * from one generation <u>to</u> a-nö-ther.
- For the Lord will a-<u>venge</u> his peo-ple : and be gracious un-<u>to</u> his sër-vants.
- As for the images of the hea-then, they are but <u>sil</u>-ver and gold: 15 the *work* of mën's hands.
- 16 They have *mouths* and speak not: eyes have they *but* they see not.
- 17 They have ears and *yet* they hear not: neither is there any *breath* in thëir mouths.



- They that make them are *like* unto them: 18 and so are all they that *put* their trüst in them.
- Praise the Lord ye *house* of Is^ra-el: 19 praise the Lord ye *house* of Äa-ron.
- 20 Praise the Lord ye *house* of Levi : ye that fear the *Lörd* präise the Lord.
- Praised be the Lord <u>out</u> of Si-on: 21 who dwelleth at Je-rü-sa^{lem}.

Glory be to the Father <u>and</u> to the Son : and *to* the Hö-ly Ghost.

As it was in the beginning is now and \underline{e} -ver shall be : world with-<u>out</u> end. Ä-men.
